Free the nipple: Going topless in public is legalized in six states including Utah and Colorado

Fort Collins, Colorado, decided not to appeal after spending more than \$300K City worried women would 'parade in front of schools' if allowed to be topless. In February the Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals upheld federal judge's conclusion said the law amounted to 'unconstitutional discrimination' due to stereo types. Decision effects Wyoming, Utah, Colorado, Kansas, New Mexico, and Oklahoma. Going topless has been effectively legalized in six states after a town decided it was not worth any more money to fight an appeal. Fort Collins in Colorado had already spent \$300,000 defending the law and trying to stop women from taking their tops off in public. They had been appealing a decision, which was upheld by the Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals in February, that the law amounted to unconstitutional discrimination.

Streak to the Peak 2019

Despite cool rainy weather, the second running of Streak To The Peak was a success.

Waking up at 2am to the sound of heavy rain is a race organizers worst nightmare. With 85 paid entrants due to arrive in 6 hours to race to the top of Bare Mountain, rain was the last thing any of us wanted to deal with. Fortunately, the club members pitched in, made it a very positive experience for our visitors and the event ended up a success. The rain did dissuade some from attending and of the 85 paid entrants we ended up with 71 who braved the most challenging nude run in the country.

The rain was persistent all morning but at the 9:30am start we caught a break, the rain stopped, and it stayed mostly dry for the duration of the race. The runners were all good sports, many commenting that the cooler temperature and moist trail conditions were actually ideal for the race.

The course was improved and lengthened by 15% from last year. We extended the finish to a larger and more scenic area and added a beautiful new loop through the Garden Trail. We also featured some live music on the course provided by our neighbor Kayleigh, playing inspirational fiddle music on the lower Jeep Trail.

Once again, Anne came through and cooked up a fantastic lasagna dinner Saturday night and with Jim L donating over 30 pounds of smoked pork for the post-race lunch everyone was well fed.

Despite the cooler weather we had a full pool for water volleyball after the race and even had a surprise marriage proposal (she said YES!!!)

The Bare Mountain women were very successful, members Joan J, Jeanie H and Lisa H finished 1, 2, 3 in the Masters Division. (Picture Below)

The event was a financial success as well, bringing in a profit of \$2,253.00 to the club.

This is an event that takes many volunteers to pull off. To those who setup and maintained the course, prepared the food, manned the aid stations, directed the parking, registered the entrants and built the website, **our thanks go out to all of you.** We will be needing you again next year... we plan to increase the field from 80 to 100 (or possibly even 120) runners.



Long Range Planning Committee Report

The Long Range Planning Committee is very pleased to inform you that we have purchased our new pool!

The pool was purchased on layaway for 5% down, with minimal monthly payments until we make our lump sum final payment at the time of our final order. This enabled us to lock in the price without having to worry about any unexpected price increases in the new year.

We purchased the pool for \$4,090.71, which includes the frame, liner, 27 ea. 48-inch Liner Track/Bead Receivers, 2 skimmers and shipping. That final price comes in \$909.29 under our projected budget for the pool!

As Chair of the Long Range Planning Committee, I applaud the hard work and efforts made by the LRP Committee members, and especially Pool Sub-Committee Chair Terry M., in finding a top quality pool, while staying under budget. Well done!
