

A DAY ON THE MOUNTAIN, by Randy B










As Randy hiked, he took pictures of our beautiful mountains and then sent them to the ROAR

After reaching the crest many hikers turn and stop at the *Nudes Nest* where we have a first aid kit in an *ice chest*.





Bisti / De-Na-Zin by Christian

I have always enjoyed hiking, and hiking naked, when possible, is even more enjoyable. That, of course, is one of the many reasons I love being a member of Bare Mountain Retreat, and the opportunity to hike our many trails. Another location where I have enjoyed hiking (with my clothes left in the car) is a wilderness area just south of Farmington, New Mexico called Bisti / De-Na-Zin.

The Bisti / De-Na-Zin Wilderness encompasses over 40,000 acres of rock formations that would seem more natural on a distant planet than in New Mexico. Congress, recognizing the uniqueness of this

area, designated it as a Wilderness Area in 1984 and the Bureau of Land Management manages the site. As many of us nudists know the BLM allows nude recreation as long as you don't offend anyone (so always use common sense when hiking naked).

If you venture to this wilderness, you will find it to be one of the most unusual; a stark, alien landscape, with undulating hills in white, black, and red, punctuated by hoodoos and natural wind windows. Based on my last few trips you may see a few people hiking at the main area around the parking lot, but it isn't unusual to have the place all to yourself.

As you hike in, you'll find that it looks like a different world and like any new world it's easy to get lost in. With no cell service (at least when I was there last) I strongly suggest you pack a portable satellite GPS, a lunch and lots of water! I think the best time of year to explore is early spring or late fall with its mild temperatures and fewer visitors, you can easily lose yourself naturally in this natural wonderland.

Thailand - A Nudist Bucket List?

This past May Susan and I had the opportunity to spend 28 days in Thailand. This was our second trip to Thailand and once again the country and people did not disappoint. Traveling from the jungles of the far north of the country near the Thailand and Myanmar border, to the bustling metropolis of Bangkok, to the spectacular islands in southern Thailand, the diversity of geography and culture is stunning. Interacting with elephants, shopping the famous night market in Chiang Mai, exploring vast cave systems and searching for the largest flower in the world, extraordinary 5 star dining in Bangkok to palette blowing street food, from hostels to a floating cabin to one of the world's top boutique hotels on a private beach, shopping the largest outdoor market in Asia, snorkeling vibrant coral reefs, and more, Thailand has something for about anyone as long as

you don't mind being hot. In the words of our friends who have lived in Thailand, "Thailand has 3 seasons; Hot, Really Hot and Hot and Wet."







For us, Thailand encapsulates, in many ways, what we are looking for when we travel abroad. Most notably the ability to interact with and learn about another culture, its people and its history. As a Buddhist

country the tenants of Buddhism are intertwined into virtually every aspect of daily life. Monks seem to always be present, and temples blanket the landscape. Perhaps most noticeable to me however, is the effect of a deep adherence to the idea of Karma. Although it has some negative societal effects in general it has served the Thai people well, and as an outsider, it makes visiting and travel in Thailand safe and very enjoyable.





Interestingly, nudism in Thailand is strictly forbidden, and against the traditional beliefs of Buddhism. That said. there are over a dozen nudist resorts in Thailand. We stayed at two, Harmony Naturist Resort on the southern end of Phuket Island and Oriental Beach Village Resort located on a small island about 90 minutes north of Phuket. What is interesting is that although against traditional Buddhist practices the notion of Karma means the society is very accepting of divergent ideas and practices as long as they do not harm others. Nudism was not looked down upon or even spoken quietly about. It seems to in many ways be quietly endorsed. The resorts are charged some additional taxes but otherwise left alone and are popular with local as well as foreign travelers.







We would be glad to chat more about our experiences in Thailand with any of our Bare family. Finally, if you have a desire to visit Thailand, we would strongly encourage you to do so. It is a very affordable and fascinating country to visit with and without your clothes.
