USPS, etc.) a mailbox was installed down the road by all

the other mailboxes at "IdCity Stage Rd." The third picture above shows the placement of the mailbox, right next to the mail 'out' box.

#### Bare Backers Then and Now!!

(This is the third installment (page three) of a five-page history that was presented to the editor by Ron W. at the membership meeting held Saturday, May 21,2022. Watch in the coming issues of the ROAR for our continued history).

In 1987 the Bare Backers, as a group, journey to Marcola, Oregon for the ASA convention. With this adventure we really found ourselves involved in the Northwest Sunbathing Association. Many of the members had not visited other clubs and were pleased with the warm reception we received. We decided traveling to other clubs was the thing to de. We also enjoyed camping on Sugar Loaf Island in the middle of Cascade Reservoir and volleyball whenever possible. The Bare Backers had their own style of "jungle volleyball".

In the fall of '88 Betty and Leslie again journeyed to the Willies at Marcola, Oregon for a Fall Board Meeting. They came back with a surprise for all!! They had agreed to have the Spring Board Meeting here in Boise, Idaho. Were we ready for this? No, not really, but it was pulled off with the time and effort of all the club members. It was considered guite a success. This event was a money maker for the club.

In the summer of 1990 we acquired 90% of the stock in the Boise Ridge Mining and Milling Company. The Bare Backers had leased the land for 10 years. In March of 1991, the construction started on the mountain. The common area was leeled and the roads repaired. Planning for the future was started. With that more rules and regulations came into effect out of necessity for then and for the future. We were very interested and excited about what could be done and many ideas on how and where it should be done. There was still one thing missing, member participation.

In the Spring of 1991, before the second Spring Board meeting the club donated materials and labor to finishoff the inside of the clubhouse. This event had a much larger turnout than the first. At one time we had 75 members and guests seated by Don's count. This time instead of cooking in the kitchen of the house and garage we had a kitchen in the clubhouse. It had two gas stoves, countertops, to work upon, and even a sink with running water with a real drain hooked up.

Changes were to be made, probably the biggest changes the club had ever had to make up to that time. For one reason or another the Club House was no longer available to the Bare Backers and another course had to be taken. The mountain property was to become a primary focus for the summers. The winter meetings were again held in the member's homes.

In November of 1991 the Bare Backers became incorporated. In the Spring of 1992 the Bare Backers acquired the stock in the Boise Ridge Mining and Milling Company that had previously been owned by the Boise Ridge Land Company.
