The digging continued at Sean & Sonya's lot, the electrical connections near Al & Lori's, and Ted T's lot. Others who helped to get the drainage pipe in were John & Gail, Terri M. Larry, Anne H

(who also served a great lunch) and myself. Lisa & Jim, and Al K. loaded raked needles on the main road to the pool and hauled them down for burning. The electrical work continued with Patrick, Brent, Jim and others throughout the afternoon. On Sunday, we started the trencher again and ran a water line to Del & Susan's lot with the help of Gary, Del, Susan, and Patrick running the machine. Once that was done, we moved to the water line up by the main outhouse that was working its way out of the ground. Larry H also helped with this part. Digging at the mountain is always an adventure! We found several rocks (one we just dug around), a large pipe, deeply buried by the propane tank, and a plastic pipe buried under the road. After some debate we cut into it, took out a chunk, and left the rest. The digging is done and gravel will be delivered on Thursday to begin filling the trench by the pool.
